All living things have 3 basic needs to survive: - food, water and air.







All animals, including humans, reproduce and have off-spring.

Some animals give birth to live young.



Some animals lay eggs which the young hatches from.



Some offspring do not look like their adult when they are born.



Key vocabulary:

<u>adult</u> - a fully grown animal or plant.

develop — to grow bigger and become stronger.

<u>life-cycle</u> — the changes living things go through to become an adult.

offspring— the child of an animal.

**young** — offspring that has not reached adulthood (babies).

<u>live young</u> — offspring that has not hatched from an egg.

<u>reproduce</u>— to have offspring.

<u>survive</u>— to stay alive.

All baby animals (young), develop and grow into adults.
