
## Roman Britain

The Romans conquer Greece and most of Spain to expand their




54 BC Caesar invades Britain Emperor Julius Caesar leads the first invasion of Britain. He wins a battle against the Celts but takes his troops back



## **Key People:**



Julia Caesar: (100BC-44BC) Roman leader who won many battles but was only emperor for a year until his political enemies killed him. He invaded Britain twice but was unsuccessful both times.



**Emperor Claudius: (10AD-**54AD)

Claudius was the first Roman Emperor who conquered Britain. He was responsible for building lots of new roads and aqueducts.



**Boudicca:** (30AD-62AD)

Queen of the British Celtic Iceni tribe who led an uprising against the Roman Empire. The Iceni, attacked Colchester, London and then St Albans, leaving between approx. 80,000 people dead.
