Mary Seacole

(1805 - 1881)

Born in Jamaica.

Paid for herself to travel to the Crimean War to help soldiers.

- She set up the 'British Hotel' hospital just 2 miles from the fighting for soldiers to receive lood, drink and medical treatment.
- She also treated soldiers on the front line of the battlefield!
- She used lots of herbal remedies to help make soldiers better.
- Soldiers called her 'Mother Seacole'.






